Why It's Important

Experiencing a death could be a major loss in a child's life. Although grief is a normal reaction to loss, children and adolescents grieve differently than adults and may struggle with unfamiliar feelings and reactions.

Counseling Services

Individual counseling is available for grieving children and teens ages 5-19 in the community.

Licensed counselors address the following:

- > Typical responses to grief and loss
- Healthy ways to express, navigate, and cope with their loss
- Ways to remember and honor the person who died

Counselors use creative strategies to connect and create a supportive environment. They use discussions, handson activities and expressive outlets to help grieving children and teens.

Workshops and groups are also offered at various times throughout the year.

Since 2002 our school outreach team has provided individual and small group grief support services, approximately 6 to 8 sessions in duration in area schools.
